ST. LOUIS POST-DISI

ONLY 69 CIVIL WAR VETERANS IN ST. LOUIS

Youngest is P. H. Callahan, 81, Who Served in Union Army.

Sixty-five years since Lee's surrender finds only 11 of his former followers surviving in St. Louis and 58 Union veterans still living. Many were too feeble to take part in Memorial Day services today, the youngest in the city, P. H. Callahan, a Union veteran, being 81 years old.

At one time flourishing organizations, the Grand Army of the Republic and United Confederate Veterans today are represented by a few white-haired men and gradually diminishing membership lists.

It is estimated that there were once 3000 Confederate veterans in the city and from 2000 to 5000 Union men.

In its peak year the Confederate group numbered from 20,000 to 25,000 in Missouri. This has narrowed down to less than 2000. The Union veterans have shrunk likewise from 25,000 to 500.

Brief History

The Ransom Post was larger posts in the Saint Louis area. On January 1, 1906 they had a membership in good standing of 400. On January 1, 1907 they recorded a membership of 385. On January 1, 1908 they were at 366 and on the last count found it dropped to 365 on January 1, 1909. They met on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month at 8 p.m. The list of names of the men found in the Missouri Division Death Rolls, that were turned in by the Ransom Camp, are listed in Additional Information. There are 593 names from the earliest dated in 1888 to the last date of 1937. This means this camp was in existence for over fifty years. Some of the well known names in this camp are William T. Sherman, Eugene Carr and Guy V. Henry.



Hibernian Hall, 3619 Finney Ave, St. Louis, Missouri

There are Post records at the Missouri Historical Society Library on Skinker Ave, St. Louis. They are in good shape and found in the GAR file which consist of the following. Volume 5 of 8: Minute Book Jun 8, 1887 thru Dec 23, 1893. Volume 6 of 8: Minute Book of Nov 23, 1901 thru Dec 26, 1908. Volume 7 of 8: Minute Book of Jan 9, 1909 thru Feb 11, 1915.

They met in various places. In the Minute books it records, Verandal Hall, 1887; Howard's Hall N.W. Corner of Olive Street and Garrison Avenue (Did not find) In 1908 they were meeting at the Hibernian Hall on 3619 Finney Avenue. (this was later remodeled into a church) They returned to the Hibernian Hall in 1913. They then met at Knights of Columbus Hall on 3549 Olive St. (Now a parking lot) Final record of meeting place at Army & Navy Club 3621 Washington Ave. (Now a parking lot)

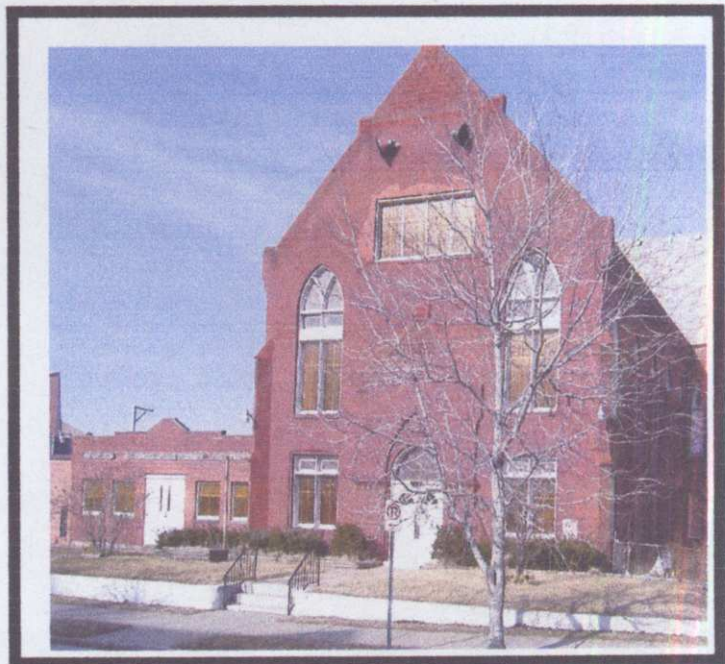

Chief History

The Ransom Post was larger posts in the Saint Louis area. On January 1, 1906 they had a membership in good standing of 400. On January 1, 1907 they recorded a membership of 385. On January 1, 1908 they were at 366 and on the last count found it dropped to 365 on January 1, 1909. They met on the second and fourth Saturdays of each month at 8 p.m. The list of names of the men found in the Missouri Division Death Rolls, that were turned in by the Ransom Camp, are listed in Additional Information. There are 593 names from the earliest dated in 1888 to the last date of 1937. This means this camp was in existence for over fifty years. Some of the well known names in this camp are William T. Sherman, Eugene Carr and Guy V. Henry.




