## Grant Camp Donates, Dedicates Marker Honoring D.N. Keeler GAR Post #152

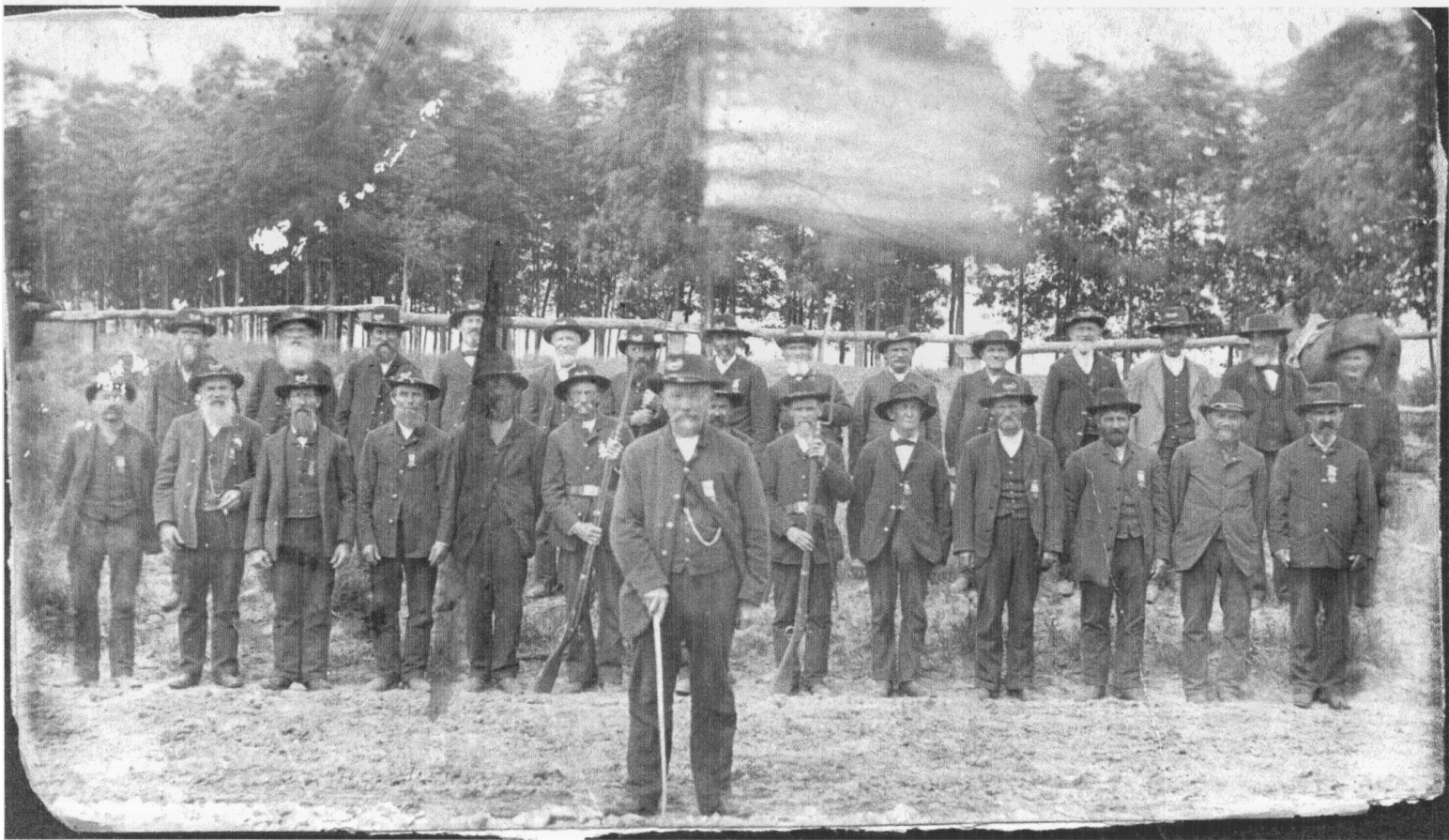
On Saturday, 24 November, members of the U.S. Grant Camp gathered at the home of Jim and Lynne Martin, 19160 Melrose Rd. in Wildwood, to dedicate a stone to mark the meeting location of D.N.Keeler Post #152 of the GAR. Department Commander Don Palmer served as Master of Ceremonies for the event. The agenda included a brief history of the Kreienkamp Store, which served the region from 1855 to 1979, introductions of descendents of Keeler Post members, a brief history of the GAR and the Keeler Post, and finally, dedication of the marker. The marker was unveiled by Commander Palmer and Glen Alsop, soon to be Commander of the new SUVCW Camp forming in Washington, MO. Special thanks go to the Martins for hosting the event.

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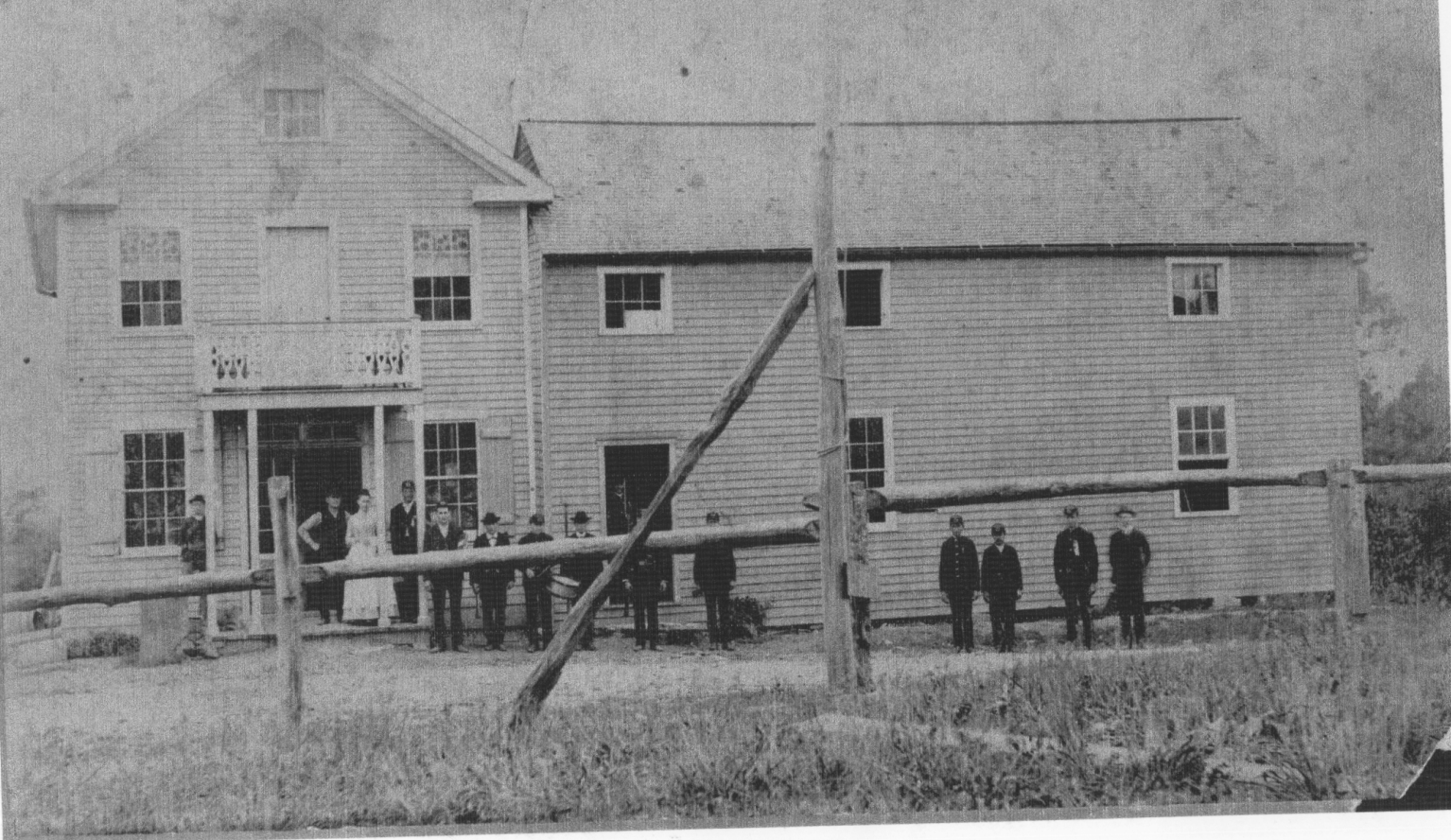

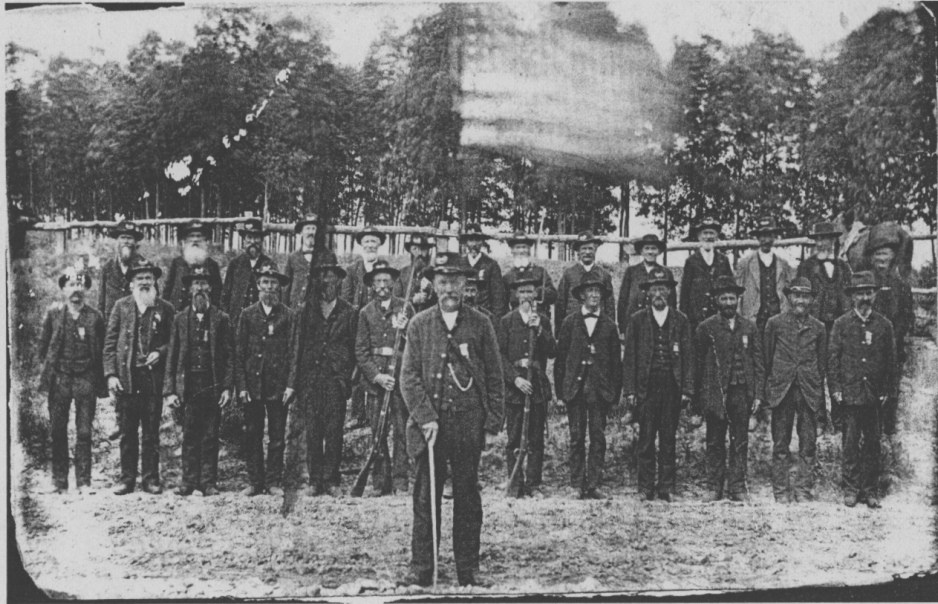


LATE 1880's

## The Grand Army of the Republic

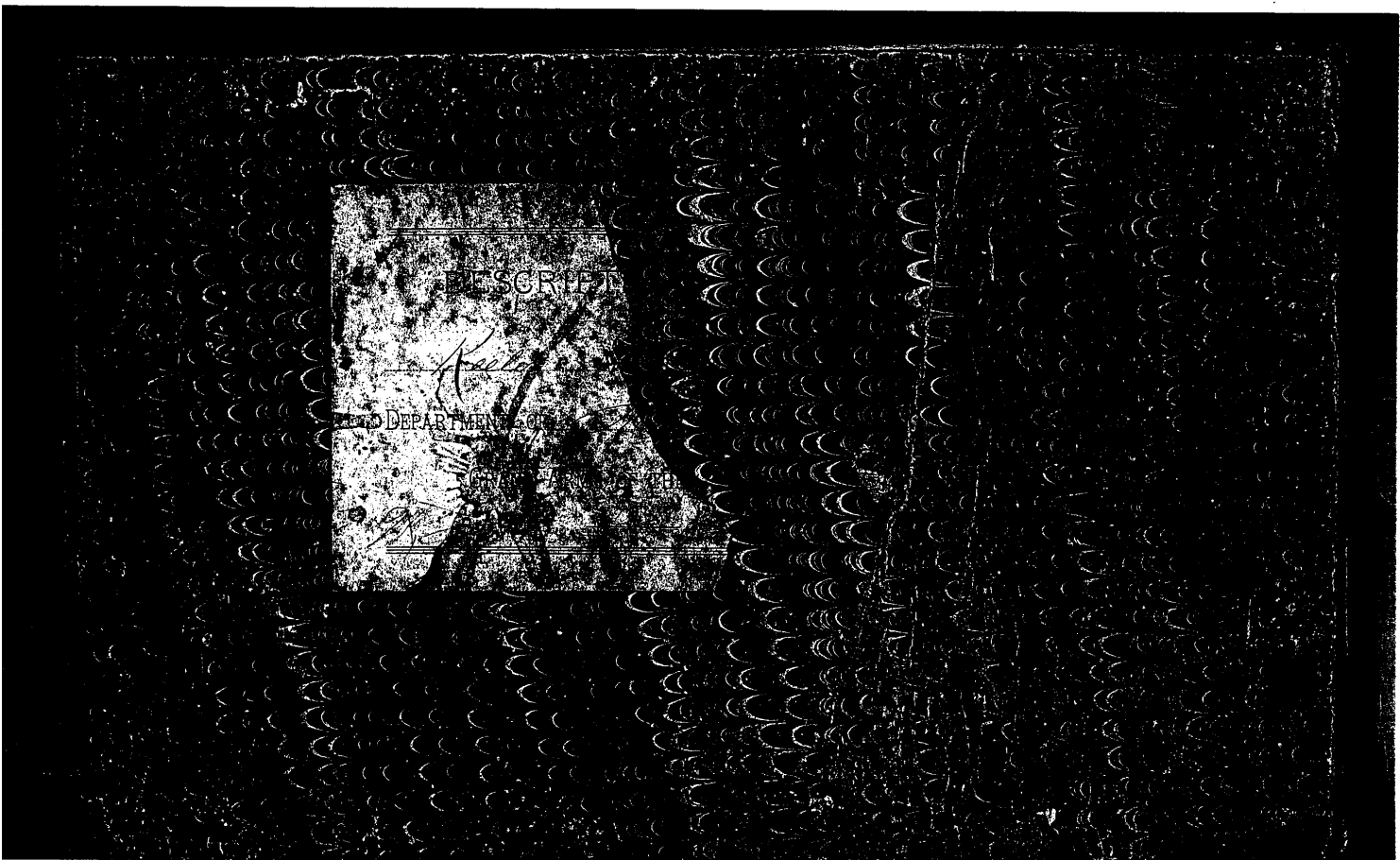
