And I authorize and empower them to perform all acts necessary to conduct
said organization in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Army
of the Republic.

Dated at the Head Quarters of the Department of War of the
Grand Army of the Republic at Stamford Conn on the 10 day of April 1862
on the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and
Eighty two and of our Independence the One hundred and thirty four
