THE INTER-STATE GATE CITY

OF TEXAS, ARKANSAS and LOUISIANA.

This city is 15 years old, with a population of about 25,000. The United States Postoffice and Court House now being built is partly in each State, and will be the finest in the three States when completed. Texarkana has two systems of water-works, gas and electric lights, two of the largest oil wells in the South, cotton compresses, ice factories, woolen and cotton mills, both private and railroad foundries and machine shops, eight saw and planing mills, and with an abundance of every description of hard and soft timber, is one of the largest lumber markets in the country.

The city lies in a crescent of the Red River, which winds around the City for 150 miles, being at no point further than 25 miles or nearer than 7 miles. It is now spanned by three iron railroad bridges. The city is high and healthy, with an inexhaustible supply of pure artesian water.

Under the laws of Texas all railroads must terminate at the "State Line," so that Texarkana is the terminus of nine lines of railway, viz: St. Louis Iron Mountain & Southern; St. Louis, Arkansas & Texas; Arkansas & Louisiana; Texarkana & Shreveport; Texas & Pacific; Cotton Belt; International & Great Northern; Texas Continental, and Texarkana & Fort Smith. These railroads are just finishing the handsomest Union Depot south of St. Louis or Kansas City.

There are churches of every denomination, and an excellent system of public schools. Texarkana has had a steady, healthy growth, with no "boom."

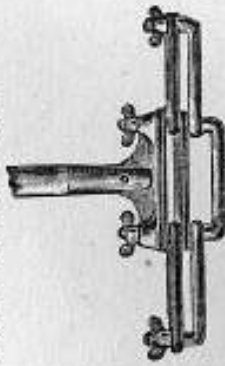

\$100 Bounty for all soldiers enlisted as volunteers for three years before July 22, 1861, mustered into U. S. service and honorably discharged.

Correction of Muster and difference of pay in case of certain volunteer officers and soldiers. Law extended.

Horses and Equipments lost by officers and soldiers in late war now recovered for. Law extended.

Charge of Desertion from the naval service removable and arrears of pay, etc., recovered.
