## THE SONS OF UNION VETERANS OF THE CIVIL WAR

A Patriotic Society—founded and organized similar to the Grand Army of the Republic—it exists to hold immortal the services and sacrifices of the men who preserved the Union in 1861-65;—its principal objects being the honoring of their memories; the proper observance of Memorial Day; the inculcation of patriotism and love of country; allegiance to the Government of the United States of America; the perpetuation of its free institutions and the preservation of its Constitution.

### Organization

The Society is composed of local (Camps), State (Departments), and National (the Commandery-in-Chief); the State and National Bodies being purely representative in membership.

It is a Civic and Patriotic Organization, founded upon a trust in Almighty God. It is strictly non-sectarian and non-political. It has for its basic principles—Fraternity, Charity and Loyalty.

### Eligibility to Membership

All male descendants (through the paternal or maternal lines)—Sons, Grandsons and Great Grandsons—not less than sixteen years of age—of soldiers, sailors or marines, who were regularly mustered and served honorably in, or who were honorably discharged from the Army or Navy of the United States during the War of the Rebellion, 1861-65; and who have never been convicted of any heinous crime, or who have not, or whose ancestors (through whom membership is claimed) have not borne arms against the Government of the United States.

The World War left in its wake problems that call for the exercise of true Americanism on the part of all patriotic citizens. As our fathers responded in the crisis which threatened the stability of the Union, 1861-65, and as more recently the manhood of the Nation answered the World's call for Peace, it is no less the duty of those eligible, to unite in the Society's efforts to assist in preserving that gem of the world's crown—*Americanism*.
