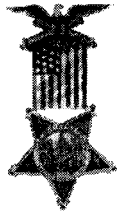

Originally, he was a charter member of Post 19, at Watseka, Illinois, at a time when the GAR was organized outside of Illinois, where all Posts were numbered merely, but not named.

Afterwards, before coming to Missouri, he organized the Union League, at Chicago, at present, he is probably the oldest member of the GAR now living in Benton county, by which this is to be understood not that he is the oldest man in years but in membership in that fraternity.
