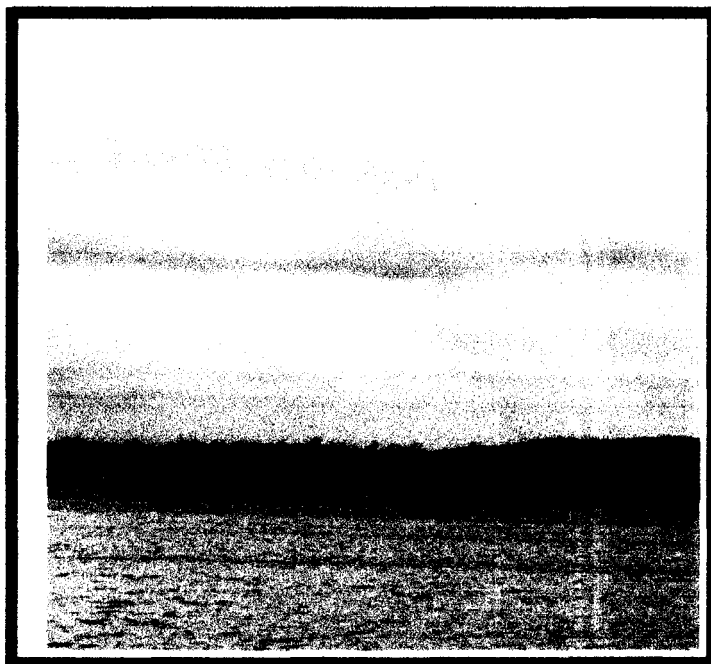

**Post Name** Sac River **Number** 362 **Location** Seybert, Dade County, Missouri

## Brief History

Sac River Post was a small post in a small town in Dade County. Not much is known except a few names of its members. The town of Seybert was on the Sac River in Dade County and is now in the bottom of Stockton Lake. It was located in the below the area of the bald area in the picture. The bald area is inaccessible because of being surrounded by the lake.

All that currently is known is that the Post was active in 1894 and that a member transferred to Post # 75 in Greenfield in 1903. It is assumed that the Post surrendered its charter prior to that date. The last entry in the Missouri GAR Death Records is 1898. As of this date there is no known records that exist except the death records sent to the Department of Missouri
