

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In January 1876, the first effort was made at a grand army organization in Kansas City. The pioneers in the movement were R. T. Van Horn, Wm. Warner, R. C. Crowell, E. H. Webster, J. T. Blake, H. E. Schaumloeffel, Theo. S. Case, H. A. Simms, L. M. Hazzard and others. They were mustered in January 6, 1876, and styled Post No. 4, Grand Army of the Republic, Department of Missouri. Colonel Theo. S. Case was elected post commander. This post was maintained for a few months only, when owing to some disturbing features arising in the department organization, the whole system throughout the State was broken up and temporarily abandoned.

McPherson Post No. 4.—This was the first regularly recognized post of the G. A. R. established in Kansas City. It was organized in 1880, with the following charter members: Frank Snow, S. P. Baun, George Straley, E. J. Stroud, Benjamin W. Warner, Alfred J. Hiscock, H. J. Taylor, W. H. Norris and Alfred Brant. The first commander was Frank Snow. He was followed by Joseph H. Fink, Benjamin W. Warner, Lewellyn Lindsay, Charles W. Clarke. The present officers are H. C. Weaver, commander; Hiram S. Tipton, senior vice-commander; Dr. C. W. Burrell, junior vice-commander; Thomas Brown, officer of the day; A. B. Strowger, chaplain; George W. Barrett, surgeon; O. S. Richards, quartermaster, and Jesse Jenks, quartermaster sergeant. Although this post

has contributed of its members toward the formation of every other post of the G. A. R. in Kansas City, it is still the largest in membership, having enrolled and in good standing, two hundred and thirty-six members. Meetings are held the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month, at the corner of Eleventh and Main streets.

In connection with this post is a Woman's Relief Corps known as McPherson Corps No. 10. It was organized in December, 1884, and is composed of sixty members. The present officers are Mrs. Satie Knox, president; Mrs. A. O. Whitman, secretary, and Mrs. Frances C. Weaver, chaplain. Meetings are held in Pythian Hall, northeast corner of Ninth and Main streets.

George H. Thomas Post No. 8, was organized in 1882. Its first commander was Major William Warner, who was succeeded by Henry A. White, the latter being followed in order of election by C. W. Whitehead, E. G. Granville, H. F. Devol. The present officers are J. W. Jenkins, commander; F. C. Jones, senior vice-commander; Henry Goss, junior vice-commander; A. Spalding, (now deceased) adjutant, and M. D. Wood, quartermaster. One hundred and eighty members belong to this post. The Ladies' Auxiliary Relief Corps connected with the post, was first organized as the Admiral Farragut Relief Corps No. 11. Its officers are Mrs. Louise Greenman, president; Mrs. Emma Wood, senior vice-president; Mrs. Maggie Burnham, junior vice-president; Mrs. Nat. D. Gwynne, secretary, and Mrs. Alice H. Jones, treasurer.

General Shields Post No. 15, was organized July 15, 1882, with twelve charter members. The first post commander was Thomas Clowdsley, who was succeeded by Charles H. Quade. The present officers are E. A. Axtell, commander; J. C. Greenman, senior vice-commander; P. H. Jackley, junior vice-commander; S. W. Midlam, quartermaster; Joseph Loeffler, surgeon; William C. Price, officer of the day; Peter Bargman, chaplain; Patrick Madden, officer of the guard. The present membership is about seventy-five. Meetings are held at Armory Hall, corner of Fifteenth street and Grand avenue.

Admiral Farragut Post No. 3, was organized December 30, 1882. Its first commander was General S. M. Bowman. The charter members were General S. M. Bowman, E. B. Howard, W. L. Wheeler, H. N. Swift, G. W. Fitzpatrick, C. M. Clark, J. H. Fink. Ross Guffin. Theo. S. Case, J. M. Nyrick, John N. Gomer, John N. Gow, N. M. Fife, Ira Vaugh, Lena Paddock, A. W. Schultz, G. W. Honey, R. M. Barnes, J. C. Bescher, A. A. Sibley, C. Carples, David Whitman, J. H. Waite, J. E. Moss, R. N. Pierce, L. L. Raymond, C. W. Scott, A. J. McCoy, C. Mailey, D. C. Strawbridge and Frank Becker. General Bowman was succeeded as post commander by E. B. Howard, followed in the order named by Dr. C. W. Scott, Dr. G. W. Fitzpatrick, Major Charles Carples and J. H. Waite. This post now numbers ninety-five members, and is in a flourishing condition. Meetings are held in Webster Hall, 918 Main street. Present officers, Ross Guffin, post commander; T. H. Jenks, senior vice-com-

mander; William Zimmerman, junior vice-commander; Charles Snedeker, quartermaster; F. Becker, chaplain.

Nat M. Gwynne Post No. 265, was organized in February, 1885, with twenty-five members, and at present has fifty members. James M. Thompson was its first commander, with John R. Sullivan senior vice, and Parrington Small junior vice-commander. The present officers are Wood Douglass, commander; John Sutherland, senior vice commander; Parrington Small junior vice-commander; D. L. Elder, adjutant; D. A. Prosser, quartermaster, and W. H. Scovill, surgeon. Meetings are held at Woodland Hall, corner of Eighteenth street and Woodland avenue.

Womens' Relief Corps of the Nat. M. Gwynne Post, was organized in April 1886, and has thirty members. Its officers are Mrs. Maggie J. Thompson, president; Mrs. Mattie Beattie, senior vice-president; Mrs. Anna O'Lear, junior vice-president; Mrs. Emma Douglass, treasurer, and Mrs. Olive Hoffmaster, secretary.

KC Post 9, Sumner, was a African-American Post which quickly disbanded

BY-LAWS.

ARTICLE I.—Assemblies.

Section 1.—This encampment shall be known as Admiral Farragut Post, No. 3, Department of Missouri, Grand Army of the Republic.

SEC. 2.—Stated meetings of this Post shall be held every Saturday evening.* The hours of meeting shall be 7:30 o'clock p. m. from October 1st to April 1st, and the remainder of the year at 8 p. m.

SEC. 3.—Eight members qualified to transact business shall constitute a quorum at any meeting of the Post.

SEC. 4.—Special meetings of the Post shall be convened by order of the Commander whenever he shall deem it necessary, or upon a petition of eight comrades in good standing in the Post.

ARTICLE II.—Officers, and Duties of Same.

Section 1.—The officers of this Post shall be a Post Commander, a Senior Vice Commander, a Junior Vice Commander, an Adjutant, a Quartermaster, a Surgeon, a Chaplain, an Officer of the Day, an Officer of the Guard, a Sergeant Major, and a Quartermaster's Sergeant.

SEC. 2.—No member shall be eligible for office who is in any manner in arrears to the Post.

- SEC. 3.—A vacancy occurring from any cause (except that of Adjutant, which shall be filled by appointment by the Commander,) before the expiration of the time for which the officer was elected, shall be filled by election as prescribed by the Rules and Regulations of the G. A. R., at the next stated meeting after notice of such vacancy is given.
- SEC. 4.—The Adjutant shall be appointed by the Commander immediately on assuming the duties of his office, to serve until the appointment of his successor.
- SEC. 5.—The Adjutant and Quartermaster shall respectively appoint their assistants, viz: Sergeant Major and Quartermaster's Sergeant, upon their being qualified; such appointments to be approved by the Post Commander, and upon assuming the duties of their offices shall continue in the same until the appointment of their successors, or their removal for cause.
- SEC 6.—The Officer of the Guard, by the advice and consent of the Post Commander, shall appoint six (6) comrades as guards and sentinels, whose duty it shall be to act as outside and inside sentinels and guards at muster-in ceremonies; and they will, upon their appointment, report to the Officer of the Guard for duty and instruction.

ARTICLE III.—Membership.

Section 1.—Applications for membership in this Post must be made to conform in all respects to the requirements of the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Army of the Republic, giving age, place of birth, residence, (street and number,) company, regiment, etc.; the blank to be filled out in full and written in ink.

SEC. 2.—All applications shall be read by title and referred to an examining committee of three. The comrade recommending the applicant shall not be eligible to serve on such committee.



- SEC. 3.—It shall be the duty of this committee on applications and examination to each and severally visit the applicant and ascertain if the applicant's descriptive list is in conformance with his personal appearance; that he is a man in good moral standing in the community; has some visible means of support; and is in all respects worthy to be a member of the Order. And it shall be their further duty to make a verbal report upon said applicant's petition, and also to endorse the application (each and severally), with their signatures in ink.
- SEC. 4.—The muster fee shall be five dollars*, one-half of which shall accompany each application, and no application will be considered or referred unless so accompanied; but if the recruit be rejected, the fee shall be returned.
- Sec.5.—The G. A. R. Badget, Rules and Regulations, Manual, and By-Laws of the Post, shall be presented, free of cost, to each recruit upon his being mustered.
- SEC. 6.—A rejected recruit may be again proposed after a lapse of six months, in the same form and subject to the same conditions.
- SEC. 7.—Members of the Grand Army of the Republic, transferred from other Posts, may be admitted to membership in this Post by a two-thirds vote at a regular meeting, and upon payment of one dollar.
- SEC. 8.—Each applicant, upon election, shall be notified by the Adjutant by due course of mail, and on presenting himself for membership shall be properly mustered. But unless he presents himself for muster within three months from date of such notice, his election shall be void, and all moneys which may have been required by the Post to accompany his application shall be forfeited to the Post for the benefit of the Relief Fund.

ARTICLE IV.—Leaves of Absence, Transfers, and Discharges.

SECTION 1.—Any comrade applying therefor shall be granted a leave of absence by the Commander, attested by the Adjutant, for a specified time, commending him to the good offices of all comrades, provided he has faithfully discharged all duties enjoined upon him, and has paid all dues (in advance) for the time specified in the furlough.

SEC. 2.—Any comrade in good standing and against whom no charges exist, and who has paid all dues, shall receive, on application, a transfer paper, attested by the adjutant, upon the presentation of which he may be received by any other Post, in the manner prescribed in Art. III., Sec. 1, Rules and Regulations of the G. A. R. Until his reception by some other Post, he shall remain under the jurisdiction of this Post.

Sec. 3.—Any comrade in good standing, on application to the Commander, (the application to be read before the Post at a regular meeting,) shall receive at some subsequent meeting of the Post an Honorable Discharge, signed by the Commander and attested by the Adjutant. Provided, that at the time of such application he is in good standing and there are no charges against him on account of the Post.

ARTICLE V.-Employment Committee.

SECTION 1.—On assuming the duties of his office, the Post Commander shall appoint a standing committee on Employment, consisting of five comrades.

SEC. 2.—It shall be the duty of this committee to assist the procuring employment for all deserving comrades who apply to them for this purpose.

ARTICLE VI.—Relief Committee, Their Duties, Etc.

SECTION 1.—The Commander shall, at the commencement of each term, appoint a Relief Committee,



consisting of six comrades, one living in each ward of the city. This number to be increased as the number of wards increase.

SEC. 2.—It shall be the duty of this committee, or some one of their number, to visit comrades reported sick and in distress, within twenty-four hours after receiving the information, and render such assistance as shall be decided upon by the majority of the committee.

SEC. 3.—It shall also be their duty to report all cases of sickness at the stated meetings of this Post, and through the chairman* report the amount of money expended for relief, and submit to the Post an estimate of what will be required until the next stated meeting to meet the requirements of the various cases in their hands.

SEC. 4.—It shall also be their duty to call for a detail for watchers and nurses when necessary, and such detail shall be made by the Adjutant in rotation from the roll of the members of the Post.

SEC. 5.—Any comrade who shall be so detailed to act shall, in case of unwillingness to perform such duty, either furnish a substitute acceptable to the committee or pay a tine of two dollars to the chairman of the Relief Committee, which sum shall be applied to the relief fund in hands of the committee. Provided, however, that the comrade so refusing is not sick, himself, nor any member of his family requiring his attendance, or that he is unavoidably absent from the city, or that the comrade for whom he is detailed has any contagious disease. In all cases so provided, he shall be exempt from such fine.

SEC. 7.—There shall be such percentage of the revenue of this Post set aside for the Relief Fund as shall from time to time be deemed advisable, by a two-thirds vote of members present at a stated meeting.



^{*}The Junior Vice Commander is ex officio chairman of this committee.

SEC. 8.—The Relief Fund shall be kept separate from the general fund, and shall not be drawn upon except by order of the Post at a stated meeting, and a warrant, duly authorized, drawn upon the Quartermaster by the Adjutant, and countersigned by the Commander.

SEC. 9.—The General fund of this Post shall consist of all money acquired in any manner by the Post, except such percentage as is set aside for the Relief Fund, as provided in Sec. 7, Art. VI., of these By-Laws.

SEC. 10.—The Adjutant shall, at the close of each term, prepare and have for reading in the Post the names and records of all comrades deceased during the preceding term.

SEC. 11.—Each member of this Post shall pay to the Quartermaster Three Dollars per year as dues, which shall be paid quarterly in advance at the rate of 75 cents per quarter; such payments to be made on the first Saturday of January, April, July and October, respectively.

SEC. 12.—The Quartermaster shall notify each comrade at least one week previous to the time for the collection of said dues.

ARTICLE VII.—Board of Trustees, Duties, Etc.

Section 1 —There shall be a Board of Trustees, consisting of three comrades, appointed by the Commander at the second stated meeting of each term, who shall hold their office until the appointment of their successors.

SEC. 2.—It shall be the duty of this Board of Trustees to exercise a general supervision over the finances of this Post; to audit the accounts of the Quartermaster and all other officers or committees charged with the handling or expenditure of money belonging to the Post; and to make a full report at the close of their term.

SEC. 3.—No money shall be disbursed for any purpose whatever (except as herein provided by Article VI., for relief) without the sanction of the Board of Trustees, who shall attest all vouchers by their signa-



tures before a warrant is drawn for payment of same by Commander and Adjutant.

ARTICLE VIII.—Courts Martial.

SECTION 1.—Courts martial shall be convened in strict observance with the rules of law governing such courts in the army of the United States and as prescribed by the Rules and Regulations of the Grand Army of the Republic.

SEC. 2.—Any comrade summoned to appear before a court-martial, and who shall refuse to obey such summons, shall be himself court-martialed; and if guilty of willful neglect shall be dismissed the Grand Army.

SEC. 3.—No member shall be required to serve on courts martial more than once in a quarter.

ARTICLE IX.—Adjutant's Duty.

SECTION 1.—The duties of the Adjutant shall be as is found in Art. III., Sec. 8, Rules and Regulations.

ARTICLE X.—Quartermaster's Department.

Section 1.—The Quartermaster of the Post shall give his bond, with sufficient security, for the faithful performance of his duty, in the names of the Commander, Senior Vice Commander and Junior Vice Commander, their heirs or assigns, in the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), previous to the date of his commission.

SEC. 2.—The Quartermaster shall report in detail at each regular meeting the full receipts and expenditures and the balance in his hands, and furnish the Adjutant a copy of such report to be incorporated in the Adjutant's report.

ARTICLE XI.—Amendments.

SECTION 1.—Amendments or alterations of these By-



Laws shall be offered in writing and shall be required to lie on the table two weeks, and shall be accepted only by a two-thirds vote of all members present at a regular meeting.
