June 2, 1887 The G.A.R. Post [J.N. Hilton Post 254] had a celebration of Decoration Day with a service at Walnut Shade. The weather was fine, the crowd large, ceremonies impressive. He talked plain English and ev erybody could understand what he said. There was plenty to eat, fine music, good attention, good order, and a genuine good time
