Mustered in on Jan 26, 1886 by Capt John Harnois of St. Joseph, MO. The camp apparently didn't last long as Capt Leo Rassieur Camp No 4 of St Louis, MO was chartered in not long thereafter. Grant Camp was replaced in Macon by Gen WT Sherman Camp No 19, which was mustered in before 1889 and disappeared by 1889. Both camps did not last and this is probably because they are on the edge of Little Dixie and a fairly strong Confederate area.
