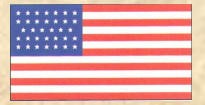

CLIFTON CEMETERY PROGRAM

Excellent weather greeted the men of Phelps Camp on Saturday, October 9 for the commemoration of the Clifton family at their cemetery in rural Webster County.

The event, hosted by the Ozark Mountain Chapter of the Sons of the American Revolution, saw about 75 people gather to honor Nathan Clifton, a veteran of the American Revolution.

Members of that chapter, the Daughters of the American Revolution, Branson High School JROTC, state representatives, family members and Phelps Camp men honored both Nathan Clifton and his sons (four of whom served in the Union Army, and one died in service). Two of Union veteran sons are buried near their father.

The ceremony included remarks by Phelps Camp's Jeff Patrick, a color guard, and the firing of musket volleys.



WILSON'S CREEK REQUESTS HELP WITH ANNUAL VETERANS MEMORIAL ILLUMINATION

HISTORIC WEAPONS RANGE DAY



Members of Phelps Camp journeyed to the Singleton Ranch on Saturday, October 16 for the annual event known as Range Day.

Members fired a number of original and reproduction historic weapons, including the Spencer and Henry rifles, Maynard carbine, 2nd Model Allin conversion, M1853 Enfield rifle-musket, and several late 1860s and early 1870s revolvers.

Although members scored some hits “in the black,” several milk jugs and a 55-gallon drum were riddled by the accurate fire of camp members.
