Found in "The National Tribune" Feb 25, 1886 Page 6:
W.W.Hiatt, Hermitage: I have the honor of reporting to you the organization at this place, Ja. 30, of Maj. James Wilson Post, with 25 charter members. Officers were elected and installed as follows: Commander, William McCracken; SVC, Benioia Scott; JVC, Alfred Lindsey; Surg., Samuel Dent; Chap., James A. Robertson; QM., Moses N. Neihardt, OD., M.H. Cooper; Adj't, W.W. Hiatt; OD., G.W. McKenzie; G., W.R. Brewster; SM., John Lewis; QMS., A.B. Farr"
There is only one post recorded at Hermitage, MO and that is 261 Serg't. Maj. McIntosh. Since there was already a post 20 with Wilson's name, they may have had to rename it, but this cannot be confirmed at this time. Checking the names on this, this really does not refer to Wilson Post 20.

After looking through the online records for the 1895 membership rolls of the Missouri GAR, I found several of the charter members of the Wilson post to be in the Sergt. Maj McIntosh Post 261. For that reason, I believe the Wilson post may have been the desired name but was not permitted as there was already a Major James Wilson Post, that this group ended up renaming itself for McIntosh.
