"LAST SOLDIER" MARKER DEDICATION FOR JAMES COLUMBUS CLOUSE On Saturday, May 13, members of Phelps Camp dedicated its first "Last Soldier" marker in Hillcrest Cemetery in Mountain Grove, Missouri.

The marker honors James Columbus Close, the last surviving Union Civil War veteran in Wright County. He died in 1946 at the age of 100. Clouse served in the 5th Tennessee Infantry (U.S.), a regiment that saw action in the Western Theater.

James Countries Clouds and a decree and Manager Clouds and the Sth of a family of 13 children was born February 5, 1848, in Flored ton County Team, smout 25 miles from Chataneoga and died at his home in Mountain Grove Friday morning at 9:35 June 28, 1948, at the age of 100 years, 4 months and 22 days. A grand soldier was fought a great battle of life and during his 3 months illness was a kind and patient sufferer.

In the summer of 1862, when he was 16, he with his oldest brother. William, left name to join the union forces, three older brothers were already in the union army. He served until July 27 1865, took part in battles Chickamangs, Lookout Mt., Altanta, Chatanooga, Stone River, Nashville, Resaca, Franklin, Kenasaw Mtn. Fra

When he was past 90 years old he wrote detailed reminiscences of his war career—from a memory of more than 70 years ago. He was an active member of the G. A. R. as long as there was a post at Mountain Grove.

After the war he returned to his home in Tennessee. On November 27, 1870 he was married in Tennessee Kincannon. Of this union two children were born.

In 1891 he married Margaret Miranda Tillery. To this union four children were born.

Mr. Clouse moved to the Mountain Grove district in the late 70's and bought a farm there three miles east of town in 1879.

He moved to the home where he spent the last years of his life, post in 1936.
