The Cape Girardeau, Missouri, Warren T. Stewart Camp No. 14, Sons of Veterans of the Civil War, was founded in 1886. They had the distinction of having the second oldest G. A.R. post in the United States, the Justi Post, which was founded in 1866.

Some events they sponsored were reported in the SOUTHEAST MISSOURIAN newspaper, published in Cape Girardeau, Missouri. These events are:

- 13 Dec 1904 Warren T. Stewart Camp No. 14, Sons of Veterans, elected officers last night R. T. Rabich, August Krieger Sr, John H. Sander Jr, Gust Schultz, Fred Kraft, J. G. Stovall, John Cox, Dennis Lance, C. E. Kage, John Wittmore, F. A. Kain.
- 15 Feb 1905 Sons of Veterans gave masqued ball last night at Armory. First Prize was awarded to Nona Hussey, representing a valentine (tea set), J. S. Limbaugh, a knight (silk suspenders); group, Albert Huhn Emil Muehlbach and August Michael, elephant and trainer (keg of beer); Martin Oberheide, bear (handkerchiefs); Leo Bruening, old woman (framed picture).
- 21 Feb 1907 Sons of Veteran's Auxiliary entertain members of Justi Post No.173 and Warren T. Stewart Camp No.14, and Sons of Veterans, at the Schultz Hall on Broadway, in memory of Lincoln's birthday.
- 2 Jan 1912 Sons of Veterans give annual prize at masquerade ball.
- 12 Feb 1912 Sons of Veterans observe Lincoln's birthday by firing salutes from a cannon.
- 31 Dec 1913 Sons of Veterans hold annual New Year tree (with loads of presents) and ball at West End Hall. Street cars run late to accommodate the crowd.
- 8 April 1932 Sons of Veterans Auxiliary observes Appomattox anniversary
- 7 May 1941 Sons of Veterans has a list of names and locations of 55 cemeteries in Cape County and will place a flag on the grave of every soldier on Memorial Day.
