14 June 1890: On application of Comrades E. T. Moore and James W. Dickerson, the Post admitted them by resolution that they might be heard in regard to the action of this Post in dropping them from the Roll of Membership of this Post by Resolution on 8 March 1890. Ask that resolution be reconsidered.

21 June 1890: E. T. Moore and J. W. Dickerson are hereby reinstated and that they be reobligated and seated in full membership in the Post.

8 November 1890: Committee appointed to give report of murder of Anderson Hodges at next meeting. Report filed.
