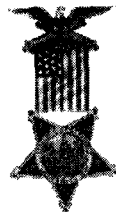

Hill; quartermaster-sergeant, F. H. McDougal; sergeant-major, J. D. Dykes; adjutant, Hawley Herriford; surgeon, J. C. McKiddy. The charter members were H. T. Allen, John L. Allen, E. J. Abrams, L. W. Brannon, W. J. Boyle, Jos. W. Bayles, J. W. Cardiff, W. L. Griffith, Geo. J. Heck, Ira B. Hyde, Lester King, W. F. Kesterson, A. K. Mills, Daniel Martin, J. A. Montgomery, J. B. Nash, J. I. Owen, J. B. Ormsby, A. R. Patton, J. L. Perkins, W. L. Phillips, W. T. Scott, Stephen Wayman, E. W. Wells and Allen Rogers. The post was largely responsible for many of the successful reunions of old soldiers held in Mercer county.
