Col. A. S. Fowler Honored.

Col. A. S. Fowler of Little Rock received notice that he had been elected junior vice commander of the Grand Army of the Republic. He was elected at a meeting of the National Council of Administration of the G. A. R. held in Detroit Friday. This is the third highest office in the gift of the G. A. R. of the United States. Colonel Fowler was notified in a telegram sent by former Congressman Washington Gardner of Michigan, commander-in-chief of the G. A. R.

Colonel Fowler is one of the youngest Union veterans in the United States. He enlisted in the Sixth Ohio Light Artillery when he was but 13 years old, and had participated in two battles when he was 14.

He served as commander of the Arkansas division of the G. A. R. in 1889 and 1890, and in 1913 was again elected to the position.
