

GARLAND COUNTY, ARK – LAST SOLDIER

Julian M. Ransier (1846 – Nov 8 1948)

Julian lived in Hot Springs, AR with his wife Cora, from at least 1930 (according to the census records) until the time of his death.

Birth: 1846

Death: Nov. 8, 1948 Hot Springs, Garland County, Arkansas, USA

Served in Co. F in 2nd NY Cavalry, Civil War enlisting on 9//3/1864 at Geddes, NY and was mustered out on 6/5/1865 at Alexandria, VA. He and was Onondaga County's last Civil War veteran to pass away. He enlisted at age 18, and was part of George Custer's Cavalry Brigade in the Civil War.

Possibly buried Burial: Christ Church Cemetery, Manlius, Onondaga County, New York, USA, see below description

The 600-pound limestone wash basin at this site was carved by Julian's father to replace one constantly misplaced by workers. Julian removed the basin from the Eagle Village farm of his parents, James M. and Mary C., and had it installed over their graves. The ashes of Julian and his wife, Cora, were to have been sent here for burial, and it is probable the ashes are here.
