Did you know that John Wayne in "True Grit" said he lost his eye in a Civil War battle in Missouri?

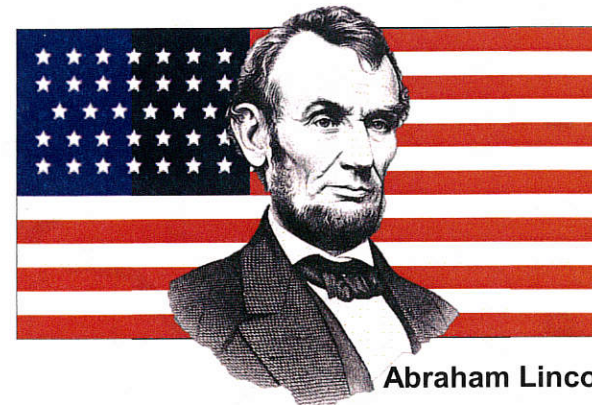

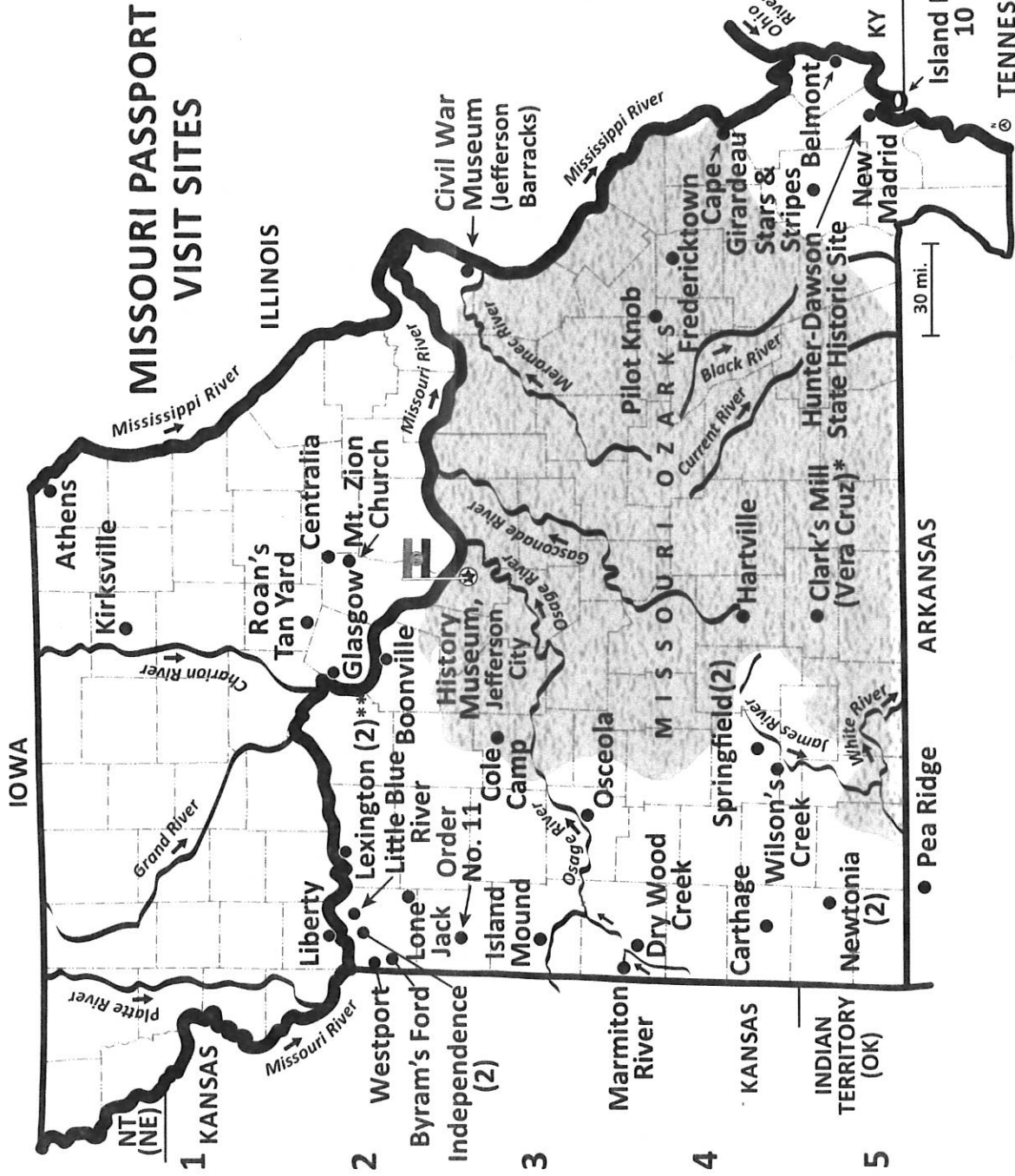
