Main, Sampson (17 Jul 1847 – 25 Mar 1941) in Boonsboro, Maryland. Buried Hawkeye, IA. Lived in Richland, Polk Co., MO. Only Sampson Main in NPS database served with the 1st Potomac Home Brigade, Maryland (Union) Cavalry, Co H as a private.

Mitchell, John O. (11 Apr 1849 - Jan 1941). Co. F, 8th Iowa Cav. Buried 12 Jan 1941 Pleasant Ridge Cemetery. Lived in Aldrich for 40 years.
