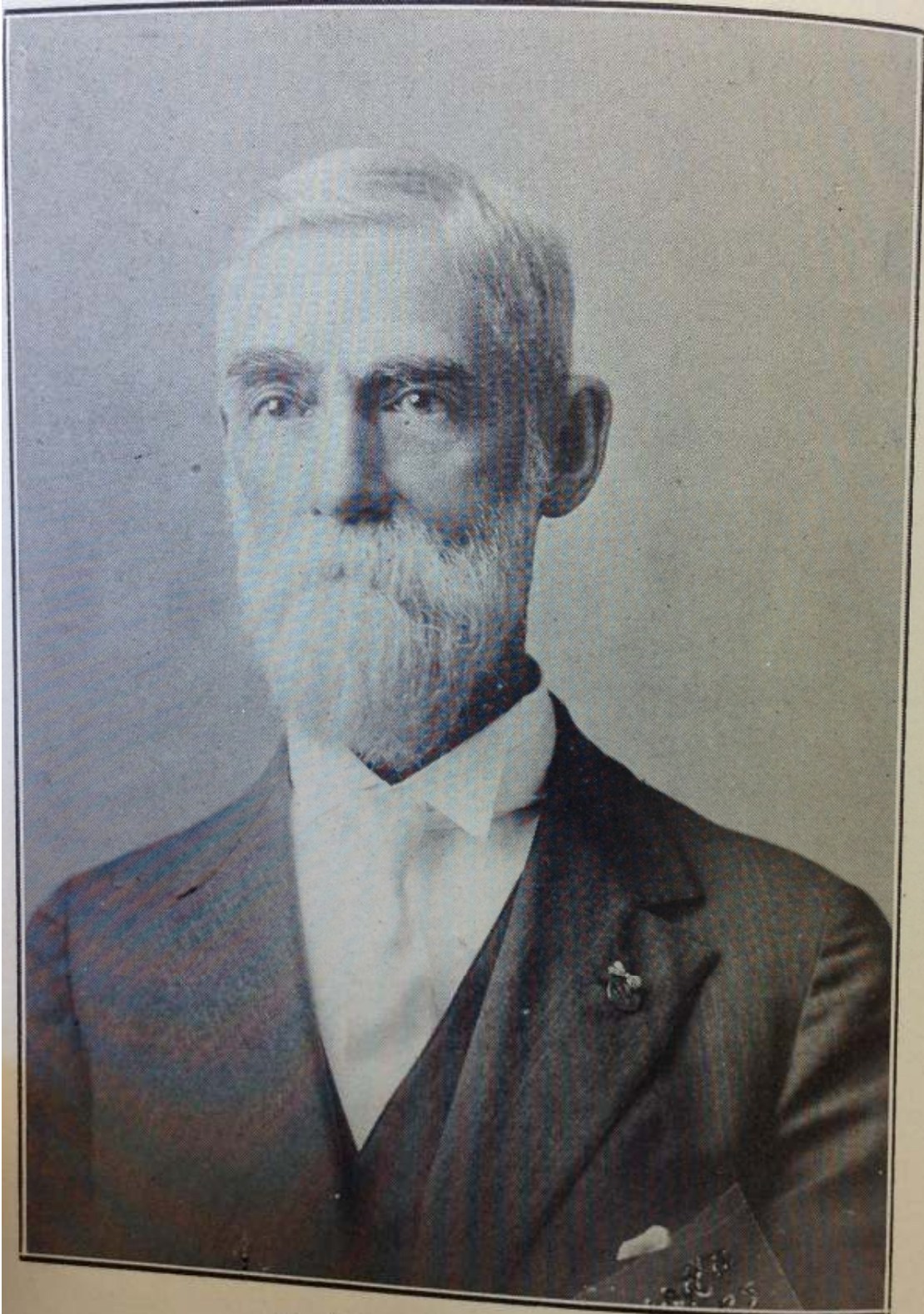


# Samuel D. Webster 1920

Webster was born on Sept 19 or 22, 1844 (or 1845) to Richard A. Webster and his wife in Martinsburg, VA. He enlisted on February 28, 1862 in Co. D 13<sup>th</sup> MA and was later transferred to Co F 39<sup>th</sup> MA Inf. He was discharged Feb. 28, 1865. He mustered into the Ransom Post 131, St. Louis in 1886 and was its Commander in 1911.

After relocating to Kirkwood, Mo, Webster was employed as a statistician for the Terminal Railroad Co. He was married to Adell (unknown maiden name). By appointment of the Governor of the State, he was a member of the Board of Trustees of the State Federal Soldiers' Home and at the time of his death was President of the Board.

At the time of his death due to pneumonia on February 29, 1928, and for many years prior thereto he was Adjutant of the Post. He was elected Department Commander in May, 1920. For many years he was a member of the Department Council of Administration and at last (1927?) National Encampment, he was elected a member of the National C. of A. He is buried in Oak Hill Cemetery outside of Kirkwood, MO.
