Fordland Post No. 249, G. A. R., elected the following named officers in December, 1887: J. S. Taggard, C.; David Hardy, S. V. C.; James Cheatham, J. V. C.; Jesse Farr, Adjutant; William Lemming, Surgeon; M. McDales, Chaplain; S. Johnson, Q. M.;

William Lee, O. of D., and James Farler, O. of G. The post then claimed sixty members. A camp of Sons of Veterans was mustered in in the fall.

The elevation of Fordland is 1,600 feet.
