

Youngest Is P. H. Callahan, 81, Who Served in Union Army.

Sixty-five years since Lee's sur-render finds only 11 of his former followers surviving in St. Louis and 58 Union veterans still living. Many were too reable to take part in Momorial Day services today, the youngest in the city, P. H. Callahan, a Union veteran, being 81 rears old.

At one time flourishing organizations, the Grand Army of the Re-public and United Confederate Veterans today are represented by a few white-haired men and gradually diminishing membership lists. It is estimated that there were once 3000 Confederate veterans in the city and from 2000 to 5000 Union men.

In its peak year the Confederate & group numbered from 20,000 to 25,000 in Missouri. This has narrowed down to less than 2000. The Union veterans have shrunk likewise from 25,000 to 500.
