GAR POSTS RECORDS From the National Tribune Mar 15, 1883:

Comrade R.W. Darsh, Butler, Bates county, Mo., writes that Bates County Post, No. 58, was mustered by Colonel A.P. Pease, A.A.G., on January 27th, with twenty-five charter members. The following are the officers: Commander, D.F. Beegle; S.V.C., D. Walker; J.V.C., H.C. Wyatt; O.D., I.N. Davidson; Surgeon, J. Everingham; Chaplain, H. Gipson; O.G., A. Lamb; Adj't, J.M. Nailor; Q.M., A.L. McBride; Q.M.S., H. Steele; S.M., J.W. Patterson. Twenty old veterans have come in since the muster, and there are fourteen more applications on file. The Post is composed of good material; all the members are enthusiastic workers and it is under the wise management of a good commander.

March 12, 1883 National Tribune:

"Junior," Butler, Bates county, Mo, writes us that on January 27th, Ass't Adj't Gen. A.P. Pease mustered Bates County Post, No. 58, and installed the following officers: Commander, D.F. Beegle; S.V.C., David Walker; J.V.C., H.C. Wyatt; O.D., I.N. Davidson; O.G., A. H. Lamb; Surgeon, J. Everingham; Chaplain, Harvey Gipson; Q.M., A.L. McBride; Adj't, J.M. Nailor; Q. M.S., H. C. Steele; S.M., J.W. Patterson. The post now has forty-eight members.
