
Albert Melville Reynolds, 1932

Member post #7 in St. Joseph, Buchanan Co., He was born in 1844 and died in 1935. He was a minister and was married to Julia Reynolds (1857-1933). He is buried in Mount Mora Cemetery, St. Joseph, MO.

From an article in the Cape Girardeau Southeast Missourian, May 10, 1932 page 3:

Rev. A.M. Reynolds, 88 of St. Joseph, chaplain of the Grand Army of the Republic in Missouri has not missed a weekly meeting of Custer Post at St. Joseph in 50 years. In that time he has attended 2600 meetings and every state convention. Accompanying him to Cape Girardeau from the North Missouri city is Judge Advocate Smith George, 89, who holds a similar record. This is believed to be the record for Grand Army attendance in the entire country. Rev. Reynolds served from June 1, 1863, to August 1865, with the Sixth



Kansas Cavalry, and spent a greater part of his service in Virginia. He was the only member of his family on the Northern side.
