- (4) Only the affirmative vote may be reconsidered.
- (5) Debatable when applied to a debatable motion.
- (6) Majority with notice, or 2/3 without notice or majority of entire membership.
- (7) Majority or tie vote sustains the chair.
- (8) None of these motions (except Reconsider) are in order when business is pending.
- (9) Rules of order, 2/3 vote Standing rules, majority vote.
- (10) Must be proposed before debate has begun or a subsidiary motion is stated by the chair (applied to original main motions.
- (11) The Incidental Motions have no precedence (rank). They are in order when the need arises.
- (12) A Main Motion if made when not business is pending.
- (13) The maker of a motion may withdraw it without permission of the assembly before the motion is stated by the chair.
- (14) The chair can complete a Division of the Assembly (standing vote) without permission of the assembly and any member can demand it.
- (15) Upon a call by a single member, the Orders of the Day must be enforced.

- The National Coordinator will have a National email address.
- 2, He will be in charge of keeping the web site updated.
- 3, Establish and maintain contact with the National Office of the Boy Scouts of America.
- 4. To keep the BSA informed of any changes to our program.
- To receive requests for certificates and send those requests to the Department/Camp-At-Large Eagle Scout Coordinator for action.
- If there is no Department/Camp-at-Large in the area where the Eagle Scout resides, he will make arrangements for presenting the certificate.
- 7, To request from each Department/Camp-At-Large, statistics regarding the presentation of Eagle Scout Certificates. The report is due by July 10<sup>th</sup> and will include the TOTAL number of certificates presented by the Camps and Department
- Provide a report to the National Encampment each year of the activities of the SUVCW Eagle Scout Program.
- 9. To keep records of the total number of certificates presented during the year.
- To perform all other duties as regulated by the C&R, National Encampment and Commander-in-Chief.

#### Department Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinators

- 1, The Department commander is encouraged to appoint an Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinator to coordinate and/or perform the following duties. Departments that do not elect to appoint an Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinator are still required to perform the duties listed below and the information for filling out the certificate will be sent to the Department Commander
- He must have an email address and keep the NESCC informed of any changes.
- He must maintain a listing of the Scout Councils and their office address in their Department.
- 4, To keep in close contact with all camp Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinators.
- To receive requests for Eagle Scout Certificates and send the requests to the camps to make arrangements to present the certificate.
- If there is no Camp in the area where the Eagle Scout resides, he will make arrangements for presenting the certificate.
- Submit a report to the Department Encampment showing the total number of certificates presented.
- Submit a report to the NESCC by July 10<sup>th</sup> showing the total number of certificates presented by the Camps and Department.
- 9, To keep records of the total number of certificates presented during the year.
- To perform all other duties as regulated by the C&R, National Encampment and Commander-in-Chief.

# Camp Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinators

- 1, If a camp does not want to participate in this program the Department Eagle Scout Coordinator is responsible for the certificates. If the camp wants to participate the Camp Commander is encouraged to appoint an Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinator to coordinate and/or perform the following duties. Camps that do not elect to appoint an Eagle Scout Certificate Coordinator are still required to perform the duties listed below and the information for filling out the certificates will be sent to the Camp Commander.
- 2, He must have an email address and keep the DESCC informed of any changes.
- 3, He must maintain a listing of the Scout Council and their office address in their area.
- 4, Establish and maintain contact with the local Scout Council in their area.
- 5. To keep the Scout Council informed of any changes to our program.
- To receive requests for Eagle Scout Certificates and make arrangements to present the certificate
- Submit a report to the Camp Encampment showing the total number of certificates presented.
- To keep a record of all certificates presented during the year and provide this to the DESCC by July 1<sup>st</sup>.
- 8, To perform all other duties as regulated by the C&R, National encampment and Commander-in-Chief.
