Springdale also had a US Grant Post. Another POST 10 has also been found, probably one from reorganization efforts as membership was lost. That one is Steadman Post in Paris AR. This Post was known to be active in 1897 and through 1900, but by the 1915 Roster of Posts in Arkansas it had disappeared.
