## General Order No. 5.

Springdale, Ark., September 24, 1900.

Robinson is dishonorably discharged from the tirend Army of the Republic. All Posts and Comrades will take due notice and govern themselves accordingly.

II. There will be an inspection of all the Posts in this Department between the 1st of September and the 31st of Desember. See Rules and Regulations, Act. 5, Chap. 5. In the absence of Assistant Inspecors, Post Adjutants will set and make their reports to Department Inspector, Comrude A. K. Sawyer, West Fork, Ark.

III. Posts not loving sent in their Adjutant and Quartermoster reports for the term ending June 30, 1900, will please do so at their earliest convenience, with per sapits tex. Delinquent Posts will please reinstate in accordance with General Order No. 3, from these headquarters. Commides, our runks are thinning fast. Please fall in and fill the vasant ranks. Our Department made a very satisfactory slawing at Chicago, but we could have done better. 

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Headquarters Department of Arkansas, Grand Army of the Republic, Fort Smith, Ark., July 31, 1915.

General Orders No. 3

I. The Forty-ninth National Encampment of the Grand Army of the Republic will be held in the city of Washington, D. C., during the week commencing September 27. The headquarters for this Department have been located at Room 188, New Oxford Hotel, corner of Pennsylvania Avenue and Fifteenth Street N. W. This hotel is in the central part of the city, opposite the United States Treasury and White House grounds, and within three blocks of the Hotel Raleigh, where the National Headquarters have been





established. All comrades are requested to report there promptly on their arrival in the city, register their names and receive badges. To all our friends and other comrades we extend a cordial welcome to our headquarters. It is hoped that all comrades who can possibly do so will attend this encampment. It will be an occasion of unusual interest, and the climax of all our encampments. It was fifty years ago last May when the Grand Review was held there, and those who participated therein can never forget it. Neither can they forget the banner in front of the Treasury Building which contained these words: "The Nation owes its defenders a debt it can never pay." We then felt that the country fully realized the dangers and privations through which we had passed during the four years of bloody warfare.

II. All comrades who propose going should ascertain from their local railroad agents as to the rates of fare and route of travel, etc. They also should arrange for places to stop at. They can do this by writing to Thomas Grant, Secretary of the Citizens' Committee, No. 1202 "F" Street, Washington, D. C. There are a vast number of hotels and boarding houses ample enough to accommodate all, but it is better for you to secure your quarters before you reach there, and thus save great confusion. Lodgings can be had as low as 50 cents per day, and we have been assured that there will be no increase in rates because of the Encampment.

III. The following comrades have been appointed Aides-de-Camp on the staff of the Department Commander:

James H. Conley-Post No. 1. L. C. Carraco-Post No. 2. Henry Conine-Post No. 4. L. A. Thomas—Post No. 5. U. M. Glover-Post No. 9. J. J. Curry, Post No. 19. W. B. Reed-Post No. 27. O. L .Sumner-Post No. 104. Albert Dunsmore-Post No. 109.

They will be obeyed and respected accordingly. These comrades have been appointed because of their recognized energy and ability. They should indeed prove themselves to be aides, in fact as well as in name. They should work energetically to build up our strength, which should be more than double what it is at present. Let them seek out all the old veterans in their respective localities and bring them into the Posts. It may require a little work, but we should all be willing to do something for the "good of the order."

IV. Several of the Posts have not yet made their returns for the term ending June 30, 1915. They are urgently requested to forward same at once, as the absence of them has greatly embar-



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rassed the Department in making up the reports due to National Headquarters. One Post has reported a net gain of ten during the last term, and another reports a gain of nine. We had hoped that this encouraging increase would continue all along the line. Comrades, let us make another earnest effort to fill up all our broken ranks and gain ground rather than to lose it. Bring in all the old veterans to the order that has helped them in the past, and which will continue to do so in the future. We trust that good, active work will be done along this line, so that we can make a good report for the term ending December 31.
