CAMP ACTIVITIES

On October 29th four members of our camp went to the Perryville Learning Center and had a display on the 2nd floor where the Perryville Military Museum is located. This museum has an extensive collection of Grand Army of the Republic items and Sons of Union Veteran items on display that will impress you.

Brothers Tom Greminger, Commander Michael Schaaf, Ed Millinger and Reuel Smith were in attendance answering questions and describing the items that were on display

There was a good crowd and even some historic items that were brought in by those attending for our members to describe.

On October 29th the Department of Missouri SUVCW held one of their two annual meetings in Jefferson City. Brother Gary Scheel attended the meeting. There were about thirteen members present.

On October 30th at Lafayette Square in St. Louis, Military Order of the Loyal Legion of the United States sponsored the 125th Anniversary of the dedication of

Revolutionary War Cannons at Lafayette Park. The Missouri Commandery purchased these and installed them in 1897. The ceremony of 1897 was recreated with representatives from twelve different organizations which include the Commander in Chief of MOLLUS, the Sons of the Revolution, Sons of the American Revolution, Daughters of the American Revolution, Children of the American Revolution, Society of Colonial Wars, Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Auxiliary of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War, Daughters of Union Veterans of the Civil War 1861-1865, the St Charles Drum and Fife Corps and the Minister of the 2nd Presbyterian Church of St Louis whose Pastor in 1897. Gary Scheel participated in this activity.

November 5th Pecanpalooza in Ste. Genevieve

Brother Tom Greminger and Commander Michael Schaaf participated in the Military Time Line sponsored by the French Colonial America It was a windy day with wind gusts up to 35 miles an hour and a chance of rain. The criteria to be awarded this Certificate are as follows.

Certificates may be awarded by Camps or Departments to individuals, companies or agencies, which proudly, conspicuously, and properly fly or display the US Flag. Businesses which fly flags as advertising should not be considered for this award. Recommendations and nominations for this certificate are made to the Camp, Department, or National Patriotic Instructors who will make the final determination for presenting the certificate. Any Brother may nominate candidates to a Patriotic Instructor for Recognition.





children.





seven days a week. The flag is huge is 15 feet by 25 feet on a 70 foot flag pole. It was a windy day as you can tell by the way the flag is flying and the pole is leaning. As we are usually attracted the

flag on the outside, the interior of the building is patriotic as well. The tables are a facsimile

of a flag. Ryan stated the ceiling and the wall are painted with large stripes. He said that there were thirteen red and white stripes in the center of the room up starting from the floor up the wall and across the ceiling and to the floor on the opposite side of the room.

When asked why a business that started in May 2022 would have such a patriotic theme. Ryan responded, "Our Country needs more America." He went on to explain that there seems to be less of a love for the United States and more
