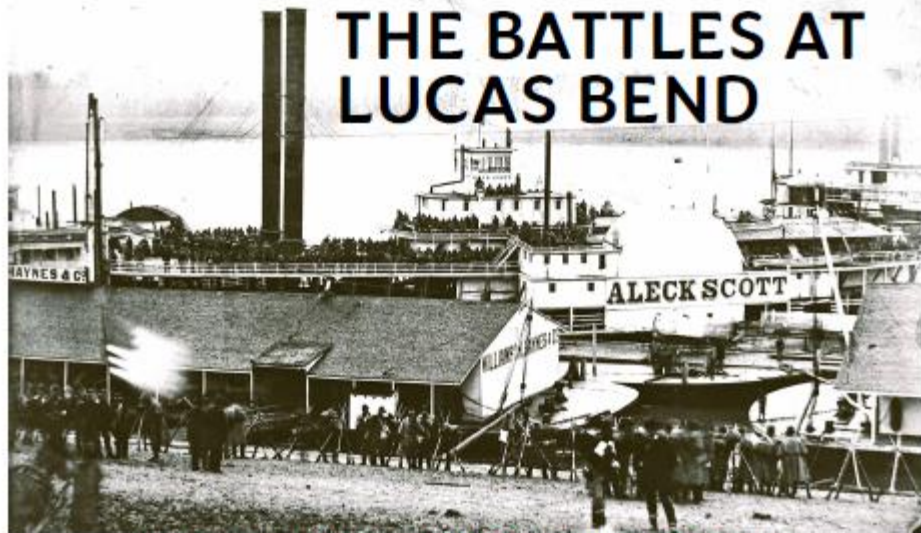

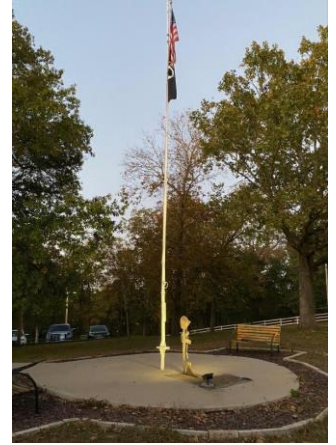
Camp Activities
