Civil War history has been a major part of my life since I was around seven years old (as that is when the history bug bit me). My reenacting years began in 1995, and I have been in uniform ever since. Then, I joined the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War with the U.S. Grant Camp #68 in March 2005 deriving my membership from my great-great-great grandfather, Williams S. Reed (25th Missouri Infantry, Company K and later 1st Missouri Engineers, Company C) who served the Union war effort from October 7, 1862 – July 22, 1865. By the Fall of 2006, I had the honor of starting the Gen. James R. McCormick Camp #215 S.U.V.C.W. in St. Francois County and serving several terms as Camp Commander

(before this camp merged into Fletcher Camp in October 2016). In addition, I have also served as Counselor for the Louisa Volker Auxiliary since 2008 and as Department of Missouri Commander for the S.U.V.C.W. from 2011–2012. I was fortunate enough to have serve through the ranks of the Sons of Veterans Reserve from Private through 1st Lieutenant and also started the 47th Missouri Infantry, Company E – S.V.R. (retiring with the rank of 1st Lieutenant in September 2016). I am also a graduate of the Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War's Memorial University program.

Furthermore, I have had the privilege to have worked for and volunteered for many historic sites (both Missouri State Historic Sites and National Park Service), libraries, and many other organizations. My educational background also has benefited my love of history, as I hold a Bachelor of Science degree in Elementary Education (with a minor in Social Studies) and a Master of Arts degree in Civil War Military History. A few of the accolades for my service to Civil War history have been: Francis P. Blair, Jr. Award and Meritorious Service Award (Department of Missouri); Meritorious Service Award (National S.U.V.C.W.); Meritorious Service Award with Silver Star (Sons of Veterans Reserve); Major Augustus Davis Award (National A.S.U.V.C.W.); resolutions from the Missouri State Senate & House of Representatives; a 34-Star U.S. flag flown by the U.S. Navy over the *U.S.S. Constitution* with Certificate; and, a special recognition letter from Missouri State Governor Mike Parson. I am also an Assistant Cub Scout Master for Pack #423 in Park Hills, Missouri, teach 5th Grade Title 1 Reading Intervention for North St. Francois County Intermediate School in Desloge, and teach American History 1 for Mineral Area College in Park Hills (which I have done for the past nine-plus years).

Anyway, that's enough about me. I hope to see more interest sparked amongst our group and that we can have a great year. One thing that will be changing is our meeting days $-2^{\rm nd}$ Mondays monthly (as agreed upon at our October & November meetings). I would also like to see what interests that our members might have. One idea is to try to have a shorter business meeting followed by a history program of sorts. Another idea, that

has been tossed around, is to do some more living histories, and maybe set up at Battle of Pilot Knob site for a weekend. I will try to get a questionnaire (possibly one that can remain anonymous) out in an email to see just what everyone would like to see our groups do over the next year.

In closing, I want you all to realize that while I have many irons in many fires, I am usually always available via email or text, and want you to be able to reach out to me at any time. So, here's to a great upcoming year honoring our ancestors, teaching others of America's History, and having fun with our Civil War groups! Take care and keep an eye on your emails!
