OCTOBER 8, PUMPKIN FESTIVAL, CALEDONIA

GEN. FLETCHER Camp 47

The Pumpkin Festival is a big draw and allows the camp and auxiliary to do some fundraising and recruiting.





OCTOBER 14, SUNRISE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, DE SOTO

Brothers Bob AuBuchon, Ted Howell, Doug Roussin and members of the Turner Brigade set up Camp outside of the Sunrise Elementary School (grades K-8). For six and one-half hours, the Camp and others educated and drilled waves of students from the school.





Hands-on topics shown were Civil War camp life, games, clothing, money, and armaments. Our Camp gave out SUVCW wooden nickels to the schoolchildren as a remembrance of the on-site field trip.



OCTOBER 17, GEN. JOHN A. LOGAN MUSEUM, MURPHYSBORO, ILL.

Brothers Bob AuBuchon and Sumner Hunnewell traveled to Illinois to present Kathy Bower the Department of Missouri's Grand Army of the Republic award. It "is presented to an Allied Order member or group...who has made a significant contribution or collective contributions over a period of time to promote fraternal relationships between the Allied Orders in perpetuating the memory of the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) and our ancestors who fought to preserve the Union."

Kathy is the National Secretary of the Women's Relief Corps. She is a volunteer at the



Gen. John A. Logan Museum and helped spearhead the 56th Illinois Infantry Regiment *Lyon* Disaster Memorial, which was dedicated a year ago. She is also active in promoting the **Logan's Brigade**, gave a talk at the night before our Department Encampment in June 2021, and helped host the Central Regional Association of the G. A. R. meeting that year. Kathy also creates commemorative ribbons for various event. The one shown here is for the first national encampment of the Logan's Brigade.

After the presentation, members of the public and staff at the Museum, were treated to a talk by Richard Kuenneke. Titled "A Gathering of Stories-Tales from Mound City National Cemetery," Kuenneke, a media specialist and volunteer of the Mound City National Cemetery Preservation Commission, discussed the Civil War history of the area from defense to creation of ironclads. Mound City had an impressive hospital, which was turned into a cannery and finally was destroyed by arson in the "70's. The cemetery was one of the early national cemeteries. Thousands of Civil War soldiers are buried there including over 2400 unknowns.

OCTOBER 21, 56TH USCT COMMEMORATION, JEFFERSON BARRACKS, ST. LOUIS





The keynote speech was given by Dorris Keevan-Franke about Pvt. Benjamin Oglesby, Company D, 56th USCT. Oglesby survived the cholera outbreak which occurred on the two steamboats that came to St. Louis full of the 56th USCT soldiers. (They were to be mustered out in St. Louis.) He and his family settled in St. Charles. There were about a dozen descendants who attended the event. Brother John Avery of the Grant Camp gave Brother Hunnewell past issues of *The Banner*, some of which were distributed to Oglesby family members after the event.
