


Gen. Thomas C. Fletcher Camp 47 **NEWSLETTER**



MILITARY ORDER OF THE LOYAL LEGION OF THE UNITED STATES (MOLLUS) MISSOURI COMMANDERY IS REINVIGORATED

On September 22, national officers of MOLLUS appointed Sumner Hunnewell, Dan Jackson, Dale Crandell, and Gary Scheel to the officers of Commander, SVC, Treasurer, and Recorder, resp.

There are two adult membership categories:

HEREDITARY COMPANIONS. The direct male descendants of the age of 18 years or more of deceased eligible officers or of a brother or sister of any such eligible officer.

ASSOCIATE COMPANIONS. Male persons of the age of 18 years of more who are not known to be eligible for Hereditary membership in the Order; who subscribe to the Preamble, Principles, and Objects of the Order; who have demonstrated a serious interest in the War of Rebellion; and whose membership will advance the objects of the Order.

Similar to the Departments in the SUVCW, a MOLLUS commandery cannot have more than 1/3 Associate Companions as members.

The meeting was called to order at 6:49 p.m. by Commander Roussin, who also led the assembly in the pledge of allegiance. There was no raffle.

Doug introduced prospective members, Billy and Isaiah Hickman. Isaiah would be joining as a Junior and his father, Billy, as an Associate for the time being.

Commander Roussin read communications from the C-in-C about using buttonhole decorations in lieu of badges of the order (essentially: don't). He talked about the National Encampment as did Sumner. Sumner said the motions passed included details about holding virtual meetings. He said we have extra goodie bags for sale. The ASUVCW will allow non-U. S. citizens to join. Chris Warren won a new ASUVCW (Major Augustus P. Davis) award for his work creating an activity book for their order. Sumner requested photos of the encampment. During the encampment Doug received the certificate and ribbon for the Marshall Hope Award for last year's best Camp newsletter. Walt Busch received the similar items for the best Department newsletter. Randal Burd will be the new editor of *The Unionist* starting next year. Doug read information from Department Commander Scheel regarding hybrid meetings, insurance when we use black powder weapons, activities in soldier homes, and possibly creating camps there.

Doug made remarks on our Civil War display at Kimmswick, where we met Governor Parson. It was hot but it was fun. We heard later that the Governor liked the visit with our Camp. Doug and Kathy had their picture in *The Leader*, where the event was covered.

Doug thanked everyone who participated in Train Days, where we sold a lot of wooden weaponry. We received a nice thank you note from the organizers.

We heard about the destruction of the GAR bronze statue in a Laclede, Missouri, cemetery. It's unsure if it was vandalism or straight-line winds. We will need to raise money for its repair.

Sumner gave his secretary's report. He asked Doug to invoice Walt Busch for his book, which was given to the C-in-C during the National Encampment campfire. He also mentioned a bicentennial parade in Jefferson City on September 18.

The ASUVCW's reported that we received \$96 on their quilt raffle. They were unsure how much money they made on doll sales during Train Days. They will make more dolls for Pilot Knob, where they will need their own table.

All were invited to Ste. Genevieve for an event on August 28 with the St. James Camp.

OLD BUSINESS

Doug talked about replacing the gravestone of Perry V. Fletcher in the De Soto city cemetery. The GAR post in De Soto was named after him. Doug would like to have a new stone made in the same design.

NEW BUSINESS

We have been asked to be at the Kimmswick landing on August 20 at 12:30 p.m. when the riverboat comes in. The Camp/Auxiliary would be there to greet passengers. We are not sure if we will receive any money for participating. What would we be required to bring? Uniform and weapon. Doug, Alan, John, and Bob would be there. Steve and Colissa might be able to make it.

On October 7, the boat will arrive at 8 a.m. We are asked to set up an encampment on the LaChance Winery grounds. We would be able to sell things.

On October 16, there will be a Jefferson County Horse Show and Fall Heritage Festival in Hillsboro. Gates open at 11 a.m. and close at 6 p.m. They would like us to set up an encampment like we did before. We're unsure if we will read the Ballou letter.

August 28 is the School of the Piece in Beaufort at the Lutheran Church.

There will be a GAR monument rededication at Overton Bottoms near Boonville on September 5. Carpooling will be available near the site.

On September 18, there is an event at Kirkwood (Green Tree Festival), but at the same time there is the De Soto Fall Festival.

On September 25, we will be at Pilot Knob.

Sumner brought up that the James Foxton tombstone still needs to be fixed / replaced.

Alan read the Department rules regarding Juniors. This included watching the film provided by the Boy Scouts about our responsibilities around Juniors.
