
Henry Huston Crittenden



Henry Huston Crittenden, or H. H. Crittenden, was born 23 Nov 1855 in Kentucky, educated in Warrensburg, Mo. He became a railroad worker in 1881; moved to Kansas City in 1884 as a court clerk; in 1900 joined the real estate and insurance business as president of the Crittenden Investment Company until retiring and doing historical writing. Henry was the son of the

24th Governor of Missouri, Thomas Crittenden (1832 - 1909), who was the Lt. Col. Of the 7th M.S.M. Cavalry during the Civil War, and Caroline Wheeler Jackson (1839 - 1917)

A proponent of a memorial national park for the Battle of Westport, he presented two papers arguing for it as president of the Missouri Valley Historical Society. Author of *The Crittenden Memoirs*, concerning his father and other family history as well as the pursuit of Jesse James.

He died 4 Mar 1943 and is buried in Forest Hill Cemetery, Kansas City, MO.
