CIVIL WAR VETERAN DIES AT AGE OF 101

ST. CHARLES, Mo., March 27
AP—Dr. George Washington
Tainter, who was 101 years old
last July and who served with
both the Army and Navy during
the civil war, died last night.

At 19, Tainter was wounded in
the battle of Bull Run and dis-
charged after months of conval-
escence. He joined the Navy and
served on the gunboat Choctaw
on the Mississippi river, earning
the rank of ensign.

After the war he practiced
dentistry at Linn, Mo., and Un-
ion, Mo. And retired in 1926.
Although his eyes were failing
he kept abreast of the news by
members of his family reading
to him.
