Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery:

The *Minnesota Monument* (located at the intersection of Longstreet & Monument Dr.)

The *56th United States Infantry, Colored Troops Monument* (located in section 57 of cemetery, near grave 15009) honors the 175 soldiers who died from cholera in August 1866.

The *Memorial to the Unknown Dead, 1861-1865* is located at South & Monument Drives.

There are also two monuments at this intersection placed by the Daughters of Union Veterans. Several cannon (barrels) are also scattered throughout the Civil War soldiers sections of the cemetery.
