Tour Stop 22 New Santa Fe

In 1864 this village straddled the state line. The military road running north and south was 1/4 -mile west of the line. On Oct. 23, 1864 Confederate Gen. Price's wagon train moving southwest on this road turned south on the military road at 2 p.m. followed by most of his army. Shelby's Division withdrew south at 3 p.m. with Union troops in pursuit. Jennison's and Ford's Brigades continued for 4 mi. and stopped. Price continued south for 20 miles that night. Union troops camped near here and at Indian Creek.
